

Le turbot

Le turbot est un poisson plat apprécié pour sa chair délicate, sa texture fine et son goût subtil. Appartenant à la famille des Pleuronectidae, le turbot est considéré comme l'un des poissons les plus prisés dans la gastronomie européenne, notamment en France, en Espagne et en Italie. Sa popularité ne se limite pas seulement à ses qualités culinaires, mais aussi à son importance économique et écologique.
